14.00 – 14.30 | Session two: The marine plastic problem

In this session you will hear from experts about the impact of our single-use plastic consumption on the ocean.

- What is the scale of the problem?
- What are the key impacts on the ocean and marine wildlife?

14.30 – 16.00 | Session three: Supporting you to implement changes in your venue or event

In this session you will hear from clubs and venues that are leading the way in tackling this issue, and from a variety of experts and specialists. You will have the opportunity to ask questions and interact with the speakers. Our aim is that this session equips you with the practical and

technical knowledge you need to move towards taking action to reduce single-use plastic in your own club or venue.

- What are the likely future policy changes and how will these affect you?
- What are the trailblazers doing? What insights and learnings can they share?
- What to consider from a ground safety, operations and waste management point of view?

16.00 – 16.30 | Session four: Next steps

In this final session, we will reflect on the previous session, discuss any outstanding questions you may have or challenges you foresee, and explore what action you might be able to take in your venue to reduce or eliminate single-use plastic. We also want to discuss what possibilities there might be for collaboration across the sector and what support you might need going forward.
